1 Purpose of Report and Executive Summary

1.1 Section 15 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 requires Local Authorities to review the allocation of seats on committees following an election. Once the Council has agreed the allocation of Committee places between the political groups the Council must then appoint the nominees of the political groups to the committees.

2 Background

2.1 Political groups on the Council are formed in accordance with the Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990 when 2 or more Councillors must notify the Proper Officer of their wish to be treated as a group.

The following principles apply to the allocation of seats:

- (a) That not all seats on the body to which appointments are being made are allocated to the same political group;
- (b) That the majority of seats on each Committee is allocated to a particular group if the number of persons belonging to that group is a majority of the authority's membership;
- (c) Subject to (a) and (b), that, when allocating seats to a political group, the total number of their seats across all the ordinary committees of the Council, must reflect their proportion of the authority's membership; and (d) Subject to (a) and (c), that the number of seats on each committee is as far as possible in proportion to the group's membership of the authority.

Sub-committees are also governed by the political balance rules, but it is not necessary to add up all the sub-committee seats and then allocate them in

- proportion. As far as this is predictable, the allocation of seats on each subcommittee should reflect the proportional representation of the political groups on the Council.
- 2.3 Each of the political groups are entitled to a certain number of seats on committees. This is based on their percentage representation on the Council as a whole, as detailed in Appendix I. This is then required to be manually adjusted to ensure that the number of seats allocated to a particular group matches and does not exceed their entitlement.
- 2.4 To ensure the overall political balance the Labour Group need to gift one seat to the Conservative Group and this will be advised at the meeting. There are four remaining seats available on General Licensing Committee, Policy Development and Review Committee, Scrutiny Committee and Standards Committee. The Independent and UKIP Groups are each entitled to two of the four seats and they will advise at the meeting which seats they have taken respectively.

3 Proposal

3.1 The Council is asked to agree the revised political balance calculation for the civic year 2014/15.

4 Alternative Options

4.1 Council can decide to change the number and size of Committees; however, this will have an impact on the number of seats available on the Council and will therefore require the political balance to be re-calculated to reflect this. Members are encouraged to make Officers aware in advance of the meeting of any proposals of this nature.

5 Consultation Undertaken or Proposed

5.1 All Group Leaders have been made aware of this report and have been asked to advise Democratic Services of their nominations to seats on Committees for their respective Groups. This information will be circulated to Members after the Council meeting and added to the Council's website.
