C: Determination:

The Committee has decided to:

- Suspend the licence for a period of 14 days
- Modify conditions permanently. If so, state the modified conditions:
- 1) As at page 10, agenda three to five.
 - 3) The Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that at least one Personal Licence Holder is available on the licensed premises at all times while the sale or supply of alcohol is being undertaken at the premises.
 - 4) Age verification policy Challenge 25
 - 5) The Premises Licence Holder or Designated Premises Supervisor must keep an incident register/refusal book. All staff to be trained to complete an incident book/records immediately after the incident, but no later than the end of their shift.

The register must be kept on the premises and will detail:

- Day, date and time of incident
- Nature of incident
- Resolution
- Each entry is to be checked and signed by the DPS/Licensee no later than 1 week after the entry has been made.

The register must be made available to Police, Police Licensing Officers and authorised officers from the Local Authority either electronically or hard copy.
