### **REVIEW**

Annual Street Traders Consent: ST/SBC/10/41 Martin Quinlan.

### Offence:

Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982: Schedule 4: Section 10(1) (b) – Trading on a Consent Street without consent from the Borough Council.

### Background:

Martin Quinlan was awarded an annual Street Trading Consent by the Licensing sub-committee on 24<sup>th</sup> August 2010. The consent permitted the sale of hot food & cold drinks at the rear of the Forum Centre (the entrance to the old subway) from Monday to Saturday between 06:00am to 2:30pm; as per Mr Quinlan's application.

### **Enforcement Action:**

On the 27<sup>th</sup> September 2010 the Licensing Enforcement Officer received a complaint from a resident of Sittingbourne High Street, who was effected by the noise of Mr Quinlan's generator located on Berry Street, Sittingbourne (*unauthorised location*) on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> September; the complaint alleged Mr Quinlan was trading until approximately 04:00am; CCTV has confirmed this.

The Licensing Enforcement Officer noticed that same day (27<sup>th</sup> September), Mr Quinlan's 'Burger Van' appeared to be operating outside of his permitted hours at 4:30pm, no customers were seen but the hatch was open. An advisory letter was sent in accordance with Enforcement Policy.

On 20<sup>th</sup> October Swale Borough Council's Principle Street Warden witnessed Mr Quinlan trading at 15:03hrs. Kent Police also reported Mr Quinlan trading the same day at 15:30hrs; CCTV confirmed Mr Quinlan was trading after 2:30pm. A Warning letter was sent in accordance with Enforcement Policy.

On 26<sup>th</sup> November, the Licensing Assistant responded to a telephone enquiry from Mr Quinlan, who asked if he could trade at the Sittingbourne Christmas Lights Carnival on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> November. Mr Quinlan was advised he would not be able to obtain a temporary licence given the short notice and could not trade. On 30<sup>th</sup> November the Licensing Enforcement Officer received a complaint from a resident of Sittingbourne High Street (different from the above) who stated Mr Quinlan was trading on Berry Street, Sittingbourne on 27<sup>th</sup> November (during the Sittingbourne Christmas Lights Carnival); CCTV has confirmed this.

### Conclusion/ recommendations:

Martin Quinlan admitted under caution to knowingly and persistently trading outside of his permitted consent.

In light of evidence brought forward and the warnings already made to Mr Quinlan, The Licensing Enforcement Officer would recommend the Licensing Committee consider revoking the licence. If members are not minded to fully revoke the licence, then it is requested they consider a suspension and formal warning as a minimum penalty.

It should be noted that whatever decision is made at this hearing, will set the precedent for future cases; the decision does not take affect for 21 days, this being the appeal time.

Schedule Four: Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982 Section: 10(1)(b) – Offence of trading on Consent Street without consent from the Borough Council.

The Council has received evidence that on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> November 2010, you were trading in Berry Street, Sittingbourne (*In conjunction with Sittingbourne Christmas Lights*).

The 'Street Trading Licence' that was awarded to you, was for specific days, times and location; it does not include trading on Berry Street. Under the above legislation it clearly states:

(1) "a person who engages in street trading in a licence street or a consent street without being authorised to do so under this Schedule; shall be guilty of an offence."

I must advise you that a person guilty of an offence under this legislation may be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale; it may also result in your licence being suspended or revoked.

As an offence has been committed, there is a need to fully investigate this matter and I should be grateful if you would contact me to arrange a mutually convenient appointment in order to conduct a formal interview. The interview will be under caution and tape recorded in accordance with the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984. You may wish to seek legal advice in advance and may have legal representation at the interviews.

I trust that you will give this matter your most urgent attention and I look forward to receiving a prompt reply within the next 14 days.

On Friday 26<sup>th</sup> November 2010 I took a call from Mr Martin Quinlan who asked if it would be okay to move his burger van onto the High Street, to participate in the 'Sittingbourne Lights' carnival on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> November, as it would be good for business.

I advised Mr Quinlan he would require a 'Temporary Street Traders Licence', as he would be trading outside of his permitted hours. I explained that an application for a 'Temporary Street Traders Licence' must be submitted one month prior to the event; and unfortunately on this occasion we could not authorise him to trade at the carnival, taking place the following day. I checked with our Enforcement Officer (*Michael Moss*), who confirmed what I had said was correct.

I gave Mr Quinlan the direct telephone number for Lyn Newton (*Economy* and *Community Service Manager*), so he could apply for any other upcoming events. Mr Quinlan accepted this without argument or confusion on what I had informed him.

I am employed as an Enforcement Officer by Swale Borough Council's Licensing and Environmental Department. Amongst my duties, I deal with investigating offences that relate to street trading, under the Local Government (miscellaneous Provision) Act 1982.

On 27<sup>th</sup> September 2010 a complaint regarding noise was received by Swale Borough Council. The complainant stated the offender ordinarily trades outside the Forum but that evening traded on Berry Street until 04:00hrs. I made a request to CCTV for a copy of the footage, exhibited as CCTV/01.

On the same day, just after 16:00hrs while returning from a site visit, I noticed Martin QUINLANs trailer still stationary on his approved site, but outside his permitted hours.

On the 30<sup>th</sup> September I called Martin QUINLAN on his mobile and reminded him to trade within his permitted licence, an 'advisory letter' was sent, exhibited as MM/01.

On the 21<sup>st</sup> October I was informed by Swale Borough Council's Principle Street Warden, she had witnessed Martin Quinlan selling hot food to a young lady at 15:03hrs the previous day. I made a request to CCTV by email to provide confirmation of this sale, which they did stating "the camera is in a fairly good position and we can see if he makes a sale". A warning letter was sent to Martin QUINLAN, exhibited as MM/02.

I received a 5x5 referral from Kent Police the following day from PCSO Bodiam, stating they had witnessed Martin Quinlan selling hot food on Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> October at 14:30hrs. No further action was taken as a warning letter for a similar offence had already been sent.

(CJ Act 1967, s9; MC Act 1980, ss5A(3)(a) and 5B, MC Rules 1981, r70 On Friday 26<sup>th</sup> November, I received a call from the Licensing Assistant. Martin QUINLAN had made an enquiry about trading at the 'Sittingbourne Christmas Lights Carnival' the following night. He was advised a 'Temporary Licence' would be required but he was out of time for applying for that particular event; she asked for reassurance this information was correct, which it was.

On 30<sup>th</sup> November Swale Borough Council received a report of illegal Street Trading. The complainant stated the offender was the same trader who is ordinarily outside the Forum and moved his trailer to Berry Street where he traded until 18:00hrs. I made a request to CCTV for a copy of the footage, exhibited as CCTV/02.

A letter was sent to invite Martin QUINLAN for an interview under caution, exhibited as MM/03 on the 30<sup>th</sup> November. On Friday 10<sup>th</sup> December Martin QUINLAN made contact with the Council and I returned his call on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> December. I explained I had evidence to suggest he had been trading outside of his licence. Martin QUINLAN stated he could only attend on a Monday due to child care; an interview under caution was arranged for Monday 10<sup>th</sup> January 2011.

The interview was re-arranged to Monday 17<sup>th</sup> January, due to the availability of the Interview Room.

In this interview, Martin QUINLAN admitted under caution to trading on Berry Street on two separate occasions and to occasionally trading beyond his permitted hours. I explained he had committed an offence under Section 10(1)(b) Schedule 4 Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982, trading without consent from the Borough Council; and that the case would be referred to the Licensing Committee. The transcript of the interview and the tape are exhibited as MM/04 & MM/05.
