- 4. No signs advertising the trade are placed on the highway (or abutting the highway);
- 5. The consent form must be available for inspection at all times during the hours of trading at the place of trading;
- 6. A consent number is displayed in an appropriate place;
- 7. If assistants are employed, they each have a copy of the consent form within their possession at all times of trading. (Assistants must be accompanied and supervised by the consent holder at all times. Where this is not the case, assistants must apply separately for a consent in their own name submitting the appropriate fee);
- 8. The consent holder will not deposit trade refuse or litter of any kind on the street or part of the street to which his/her consent relates; (Note under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 you are under a duty of care to dispose of any refuse in a correct

## **Background**

This is an application for a Street Trading Licence. Mr Rayner has applied for the right to trade on the A249 at Queenborough. Mr Rayner is wishing to sell hot and cold food from a trailer.

#### Consultation

We have consulted with the Police, Fire Brigade, Environmental Teams, Planning, KCC Highways, and relevant Ward Councillors.

The following representations were received:

- Kent Police raise concerns in respect of the location (see attached representation dated 19/01)
- The Environmental Response Manager has raised concerns in respect of litter. (see attached representation dated 17/01)
- Planning feel that trading at this site would detract from the area and that Planning permission would need to be applied for. (see attached representation dated 25/01)

Although no response has been received from Highways on this occasion, in March of last year they issued the following statement when asked to comment on a similar application: 'Trading is not permitted on the Highways Agency's A249, which extends from Stockbury Roundabout (M2 Junction 5) via the Sheppey Crossing to Sheerness Docks'

## Conclusion

- Mr Rayner has applied for the right to trade on the A249 in Swale.
- Representations were received from 3 of the consultees.
- Councillors must decide if the proposed location is suitable.
- Conditions can be attached to a licence, however all licences will have 12 mandatory conditions, see front cover sheet.
- Even if a licence is granted, Planning permission must be applied for.

- 4. no signs advertising the trade are placed on the highway (or abutting the highway);
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- 6. a consent number is displayed in an appropriate place;
- 7. if assistants are employed, they each have a copy of the consent form within their possession at all times of trading. (Assistants should be accompanied and supervised by the consent holder at all times. Where this is not the case, assistants must be in receipt of an authorisation letter from the consent holder)

Police licensing object to this application on the grounds of public safety, the A249 is a busy dual carriageway at this location.

The use of the lay by for parking a trailer will restrict the amount of access for road users and any increase in traffic merging onto or leaving the lay by cause increases safety issues for all persons in the locality. In addition purpose built refreshment areas in safe locations are situated approximately four miles prior to this location and half a mile past the location.

We would strongly object to the proposal on the grounds that it would be likely to significantly detract from the visual amenities of the area and could prejudice, to some degree, the long term development/regeneration aspirations for that part of the Isle of Sheppey. If an application were submitted, it would be likely to be refused, in my view, on the grounds set out above.
