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# Proposed Double Yellow Lines along memorial in High Street

## Increase in parking problems – possible increase in accidents Urgent action required – deadline Monday 31<sup>st</sup> December

The council are planning to put in place double yellow lines from the Church entrance to the Rose pub. The effect of this will be to displace a quantity of parked cars into other areas of the High Street and surrounding roads. Parking is already becoming a problem in the area, and this action will make it worse.

The reasoning behind the decision was that in the evening cars sometimes have to reverse because two way traffic is not possible outside the Rose with cars parked on one side, and a passing place is required.

This decision seems to have surfaced from no identifiable source, but once proposed, was supported without due consideration of its full impact on the High Street. In fact, if this proposal goes ahead, traffic will be able to travel down the High Street at a much faster speed, potentially causing more accidents.

With your help, we may be able to persuade the Council to reconsider this proposal.

I am trying to collect names on a petition to the Council, and will call over the weekend to see if you could support this.



## Proposed Double Yellow Lines along memorial in High Street

To Swale Borough Council

I attach a petition objecting to the above proposal for parking restrictions in High Street, Queenborough, together with 2 letters on the same subject.

Statistics of petition taken between 30/11/07 & 2/12/07:

Households approached 44 (between Guildhall & Doctors surgery)

Households supporting objection	30	68%
Households supporting proposed restrictions	4	9%
Households unobtainable	10	23%

During this process the following points were raised:

In objection to restrictions:

- Parked cars produce traffic calming, and so reduce traffic speed -  
Increased traffic speed could lead to accidents
- Parking problems will be exacerbated due to removal of about 6 parking spaces
- Churchgoers (often elderly) need space to park outside for services
- Enforcement would drain resources that could be spent on more pressing problems
- Non-enforcement causes uncertainty
- Unnecessary road signage detracts from an historic conservation area
- Parking difficulties will arise for funerals & weddings (especially at weekends)

In support of the restrictions:

- 2 way traffic is not possible at the bottleneck at the Rose public house due to parked cars

Even at this late hour I sincerely hope there will be a pause in the proceedings in order that this proposal should be re-considered.


