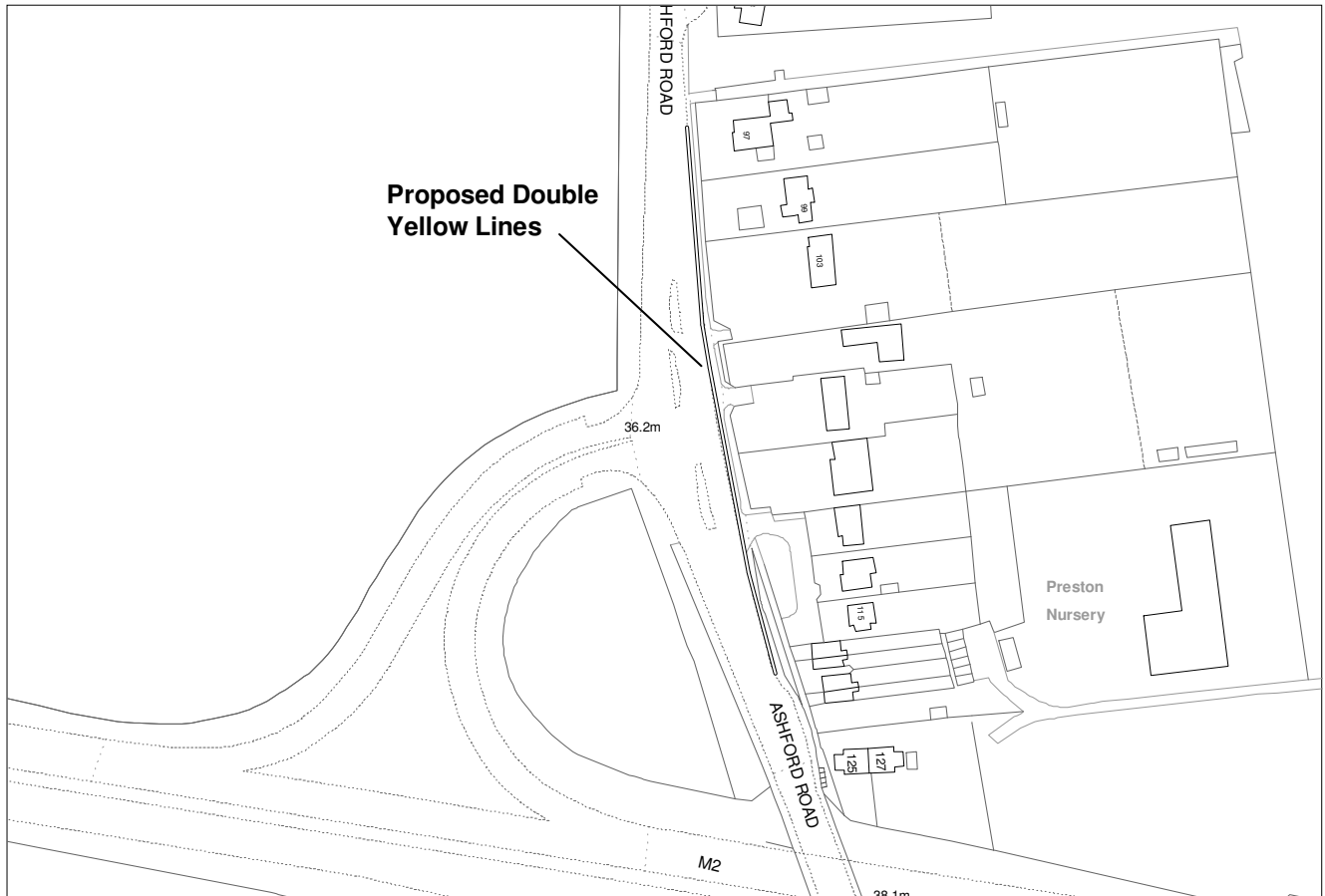

Proposed Parking Restrictions Ashford Road, Faversham – Second Consultation

You may recall that we recently carried out a consultation with residents on proposals to install double yellow lines along the east side of Ashford Road, Faversham, opposite the M2 junction. We have now received some useful feedback from residents, and also a letter from Kent Highway Services to say that they have attended a site meeting with Faversham Town Council and now suggest some amendments to our initial proposals.

Kent Highways have recommended that double yellow lines only be installed directly opposite the bell mouth of the M2 junction, with a bus clearway to be marked across the access to No.111-115 Ashford Road by Kent Highways, and for the existing bus stop to be moved a few metres north. This would leave a section of highway and the lay-by free for parking. It was also recommended that a single yellow line be placed across the frontage of No.97-103 Ashford Road, with a timed restriction to prevent parking between 8:30am-6:30pm Monday to Friday. A plan showing these proposals can be found on the back of this letter.

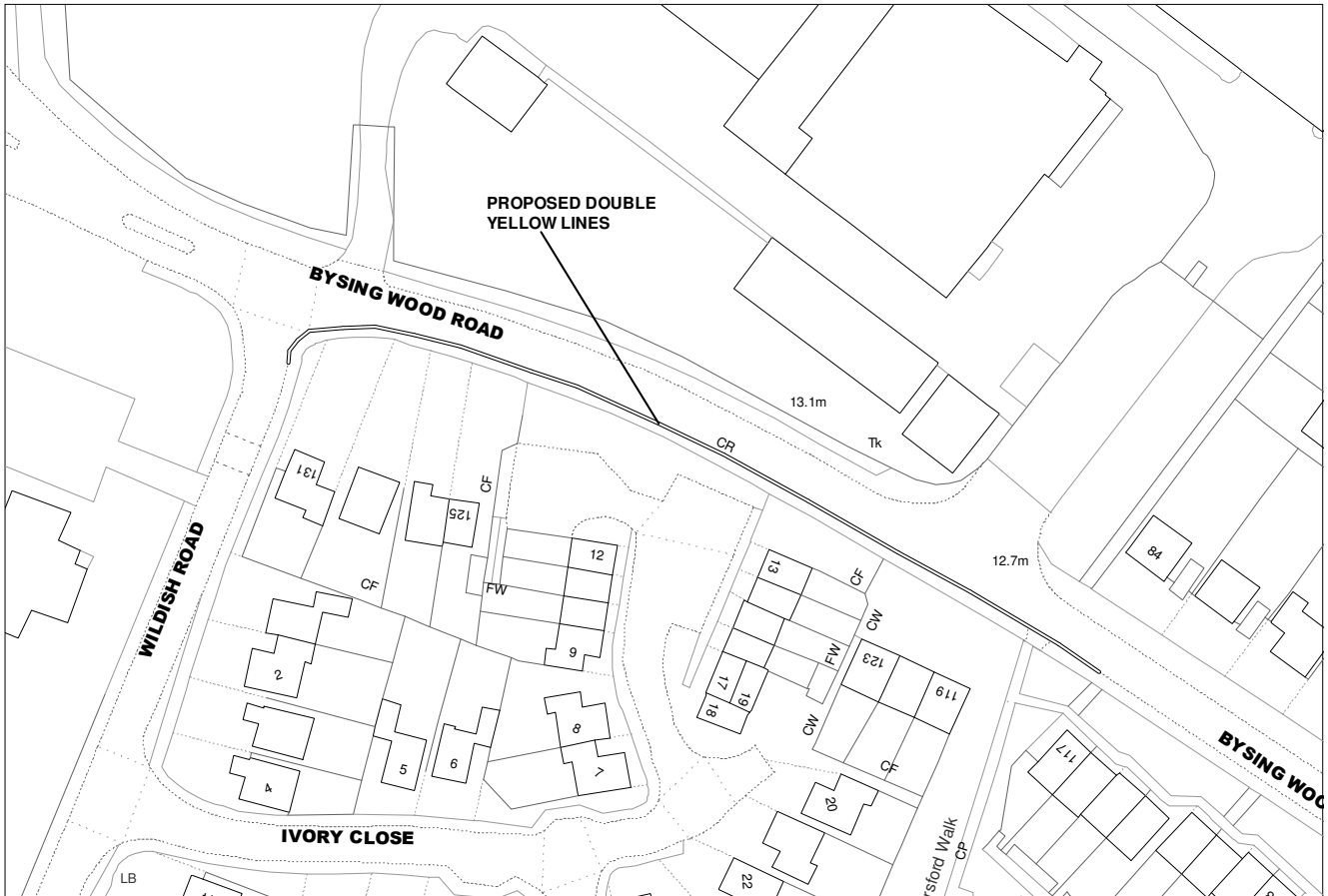

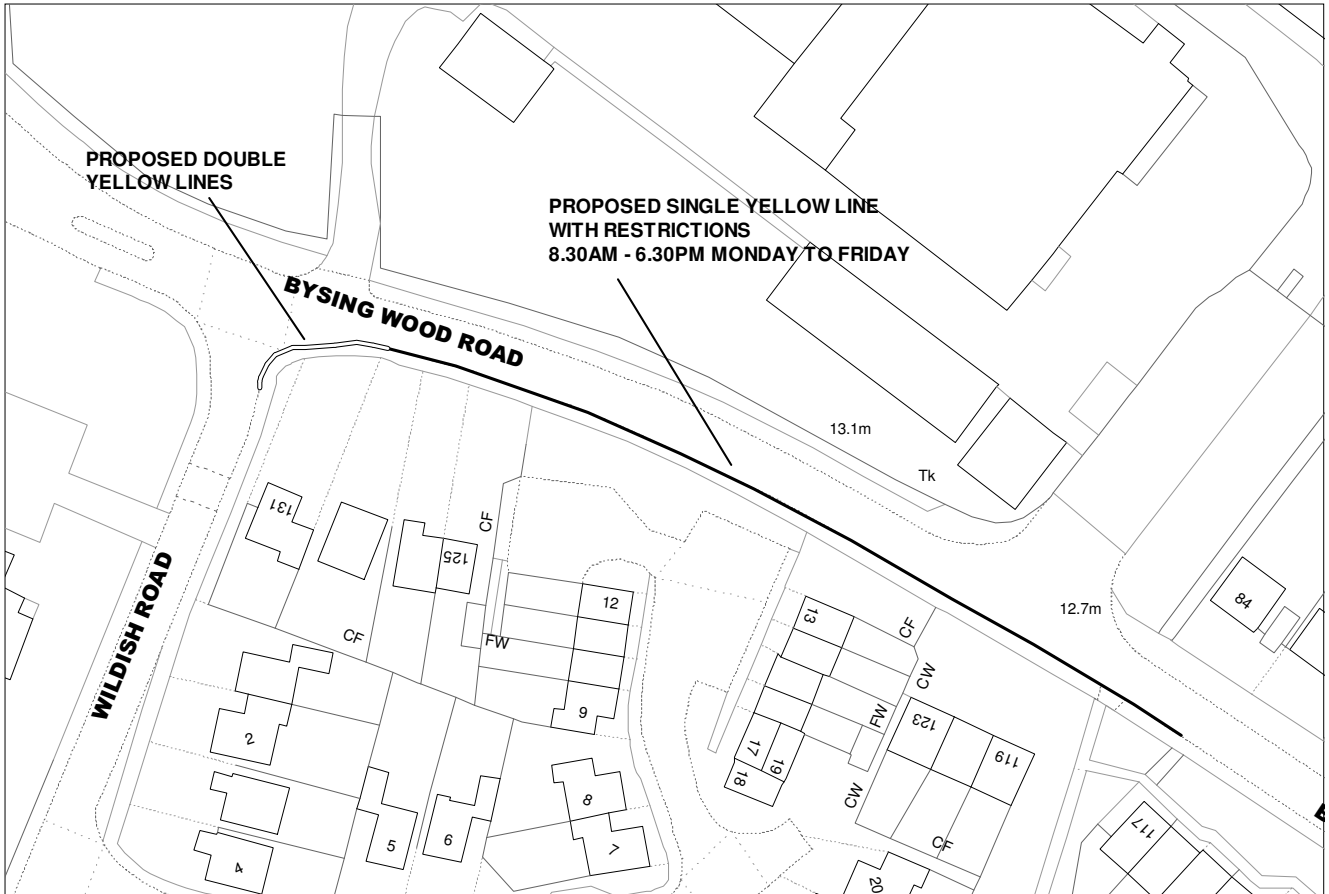

Proposed Amendments to Parking Restrictions Outside No.2 Priory Road, Faversham Second Consultation

I write to you following the recent consultation carried out with residents on the proposal to remove the length of double yellow lining outside No.2 Priory Road in Faversham.

As a result of the many comments received during this consultation, the proposals have been amended, to replace the section of the double yellow lines with a single yellow line, restricting parking between 8:30-9:30am and 2:30-5:00pm Monday to Friday. It is also proposed to reduce the length of double yellow lining to be replaced, to ensure that parked vehicles do not obstruct vehicle access along the road or on and off driveways.

I appreciate that these proposals may not be in line with some residents' suggestions or requests, but in view of the conflicting comments received during the consultation it is felt that this may be the best solution to this issue.

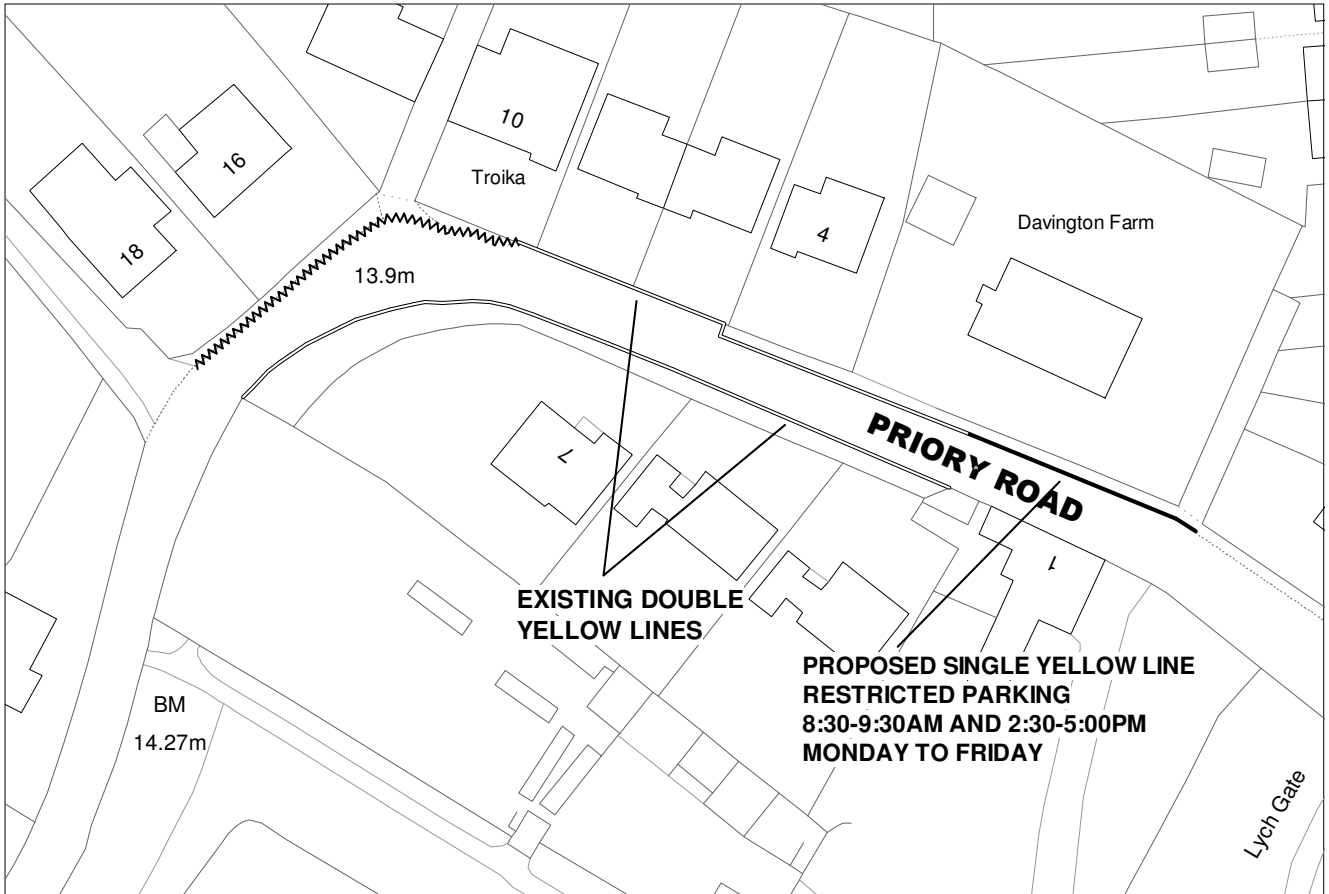
