Summary: A report on a petition for traffic calming

Introduction

1. A petition has been received from residents requesting traffic calming along Prince Charles Avenue.

Discussion

- 2. Any highway improvement has to be submitted for funding through the Council's assessment process. Priority for traffic schemes is normally assessed on whether there is a pattern of personal injury crashes occurring at any particular location and that engineering measures can be devised to try and reduce them.
- 3. Analysis of the last three year Personal Injury Crash database up to June 2009 records that there has only been 1 slight personal injury. This involved a young driver losing control of the vehicle at night.
- 4. Traffic calming in the form of road humps and chicanes may not always be the appropriate solution to speeding as they can result in other problems (parking) and complaints (noise & vibration).
- 5. Consideration also needs to be given to the environment as the deceleration and acceleration of vehicles can add to pollution.
- 6. Kent Highways will continue to monitor the situation through their annual assessment programme.
