SUBJECT: Winter damage repairs – Find & Fix and surfacing schemes

Summary: Following the winter of 2010/11 and the subsequent damage to the

road network across the country, Central Government provided additional funding for local authorities to carry out road repairs. Kent County Council was allocated £6.5 million for such repairs across the County, and this report details how these funds were spent on roads

within Swale District.

Introduction

As a result of the severe winter of 2010/11 the Government provided Kent County Council with a settlement of £6.5 million. £2 million has been allocated to a find and fix programme for carriageway pothole repairs and £4.5 million for surface treatments across the county.

Discussion

1. Find and Fix

- 1.1 Almost £190,000 was spent in Swale District as part of this programme of pothole repairs, commencing in May 2011 following the award of the contract to FM Conway Ltd of Dartford. The operation is similar to last year where by external contractors are employed to permanently repair potholes and carry out patching works in nominated roads.
- 1.2 With the programme this year, greater responsibility was given to the local teams for identification and prioritising of works. This has enabled the teams to target specific areas and drive better productivity. The site works were completed in August 2011.
- 1.3 The completed locations are listed below for the Boards information.
