Purpose of Report and Executive Summary

1.1 This report provides a summary of formal objections received to the recently advertised Traffic Regulation Orders for the Swale Area.

2 Background

2.1 Two Amendment Orders to the Swale Traffic Regulation Order have been prepared and advertised for various amendments and new parking restrictions in Swale. These restrictions have previously been reported to and recommended by the Swale Joint Transportation Board. The Swale Amendment 4a Order covers the Faversham Area, and the Swale Amendment 4b Order covers the Isle of Sheppey and Sittingbourne Areas.

3 Issue for Decision

3.1 At the time of writing this report, one formal objection has been received for the proposed installation of double yellow lines in Mountfield, Faversham, and details of this objection can be found below. However, as the closing date for formal objections is noon on 10th September 2012 any further objections received will be verbally reported at the JTB Meeting.

3.2 Mountfield, Faversham – Proposed Double Yellow Lines

Following a request from a resident, an initial consultation took place to install double yellow lines on the bend in Mountfield, to remove the need for larger delivery vehicles and refuse freighters to mount the opposite footway to negotiate parked vehicles. Of the 21 properties consulted, 17 responses were received, 10 supporting the proposals, 5 objecting and 2 were undecided. The JTB recommended that these restrictions be installed, and they were subsequently included in the Traffic Regulation Order.

- 3.3 A copy of the formal objection can be found in Annex A. The objection states that this property is the only one in Mountfield without off-street parking, and the proposed restrictions will therefore impact more on them than the other residents. He has suggested that single yellow lines with day time restrictions would keep the corner clear for delivery vehicles and refuse freighters whilst minimising the impact on parking for residents.
- 3.4 Any changes to the proposed restrictions would require a further consultation with residents, prior to inclusion in a future Traffic Regulation Order.
- 3.5 Members are asked to consider this objection and recommend that Officers proceed with the restrictions as stated in the Traffic Regulation Orders as the planned restrictions will ensure large vehicles do not over-run the footway and cause a safety hazard or further damage to the footway. The objector is to be advised accordingly.
