SUBJECT: Great Easthall Sittingbourne Highway Improvements

Summary: Highway improvements have been designed to improve accessibility

and links between Great Easthall and Sittingbourne

Decision Required: That subject to the views of Members, the proposed highway

improvements at Sittingbourne are approved for construction.

Introduction

Funding was secured through a s106 (Town and Country Planning Act) agreement from the development at Great Easthall for highway improvements in Sittingbourne to improve non motorised access between the development and the town. Various improvements have now been investigated and designed.

Discussion

Improvements to pedestrian facilities and cycle routes at the following locations have been investigated:

Tonge Road: carriageway narrowing at the footpath link through to the Great Easthall development, and extension of the 30mph speed limit to a point approximately 155m further eastwards. The carriageway narrowing then links to an underpass beneath the railway where surfacing improvements are proposed to make it a more attractive route.

Tonge Road / **Church Road**: contraflow cycling on the western most end of Tonge Road and minor kerbline adjustments in Church Road would then link Tonge Road with Shortlands Road.

Shortlands Road: the road is very lightly trafficked and can be used by cyclist in both directions with minor adjustments and a contraflow traffic order. The path at the western end of Shortlands Road to the toucan crossing at St Michaels Road will require widening to accommodate cyclists. Cyclists can then use West Lane and East Street to access the town centre westbound as an alternative to cycling on the shared footways of St Michaels Road.

Eurolink Way: the existing toucan crossing on St Michaels Road leads to an existing toucan crossing on Eurolink Way and a shared cycle / footway on the northern side of the road. On the southern side of the road there are no footways and the grass verge is not highway. The landowners have been approached about the possibility of surfacing their land to provide a cycle / footway on the southern side of the road. They have not yet agreed to this.

Castle Road: Route 1 of the national cycle network uses part of Castle Road without a suitable crossing place, and a toucan crossing would help to encourage cycling on this length of road, particularly in view of the volume of HGVs using this route..


Financial Implications

These schemes are estimated at approximately £200,000 for which funding has been secured through the planning agreement.


Recommendation 2: Contraflow Cycling (Local Roads) Sheet 1 of 2

Description: The existing verge is used by pedestrians and can be replaced with a shared facility. This land area is privately owned and permission would be required to construct.
