1. Rural Affordable Housing

Cllr Pam Doodes, Wealdon DC, presented a paper which outlined the wide range of work and policy initiatives currently underway to facilitate the delivery of affordable housing in rural areas. The HCA, Cate Ison, was also present at the Rural Board meeting. The Board were asked to note:

- i) The volume of work already undertaken to assess the issues around rural affordable housing 48 recommendations in Matthew Taylor Report which previous forum consulted on.
- ii) Recent report from the HOA on its current priorities, and the creation of Regional Rural Housing Champions.
- iii) The Rural Affordable Housing Project outcomes; encouraging LAs to sign up to 'Best practice knowledge hub' launch April 2010.
- iv) Have regard to the SE Regional Housing & Planning Boards 1st Dec Report.

There is still some work to do and Cllr Pam Doodes will report back at the Feb meeting.
