	To agree to minor amendment to Housing Assistance Policy Namely: Under the existing conditions attached to the Housing Assistance Policy in relation to Home Repair Grants, for those cases eligible through the KCC Winter Warmth Program, the maximum grant of £1000 at any one time be relaxed but the maximum grant of £2000 within any three year period to remain. All other conditions remain unchanged.

DATE THE DECISION WAS TAKEN	6 March 2015
SUMMARY OF REASONS FOR DECISION	Energy Company Obligation (ECO) funding from the Energy Utilities is available for heating and boiler replacements to certain qualifying households, However it does not always cover the full cost. The amendment will allow vulnerable households to receive top-up funding to supplement the ECO funding available. The cost of the top-up grant is to be funded by Kent County Council through their Winter Warmth Program. i.e. No budget implications for Swale BC – KCC do not have power to award the funding direct to the applicant whereas Swale BC can do so through its Housing Assistance Policy made under the Regulatory Reform (Housing Assistance) (England and Wales) Order 2002.
BACKGROUND	DELEGATED DECISION from Cabinet 5 October 2011 Amendments to Housing Assistance Policy
	The Head of Housing, in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Housing, be authorised to make minor changes or revisions to eligibility criteria arising from demand or changes to benefits without need for formal policy re-adoption.
