SUMMARY OF OFFICER DECISION AND REASON FOR THAT DECISION	Decision made – Approved Amendments to Housing Assistance Policy to facilitate the fast tracking of disabled grants by removing the need for an applicant to undergo financial means test where cost of works are below £15,000, increasing the hospital discharge		
	and prevention grant from £5K to £7K, to allow for a discretionary top up, non means tested, non- repayable grant of up to £20K to be considered in exceptional circumstance where the cost of adaptations are above the £30K, minor text changes within the policy and conditions to reflect updates and changes generally.		
	The amendments will make better use of existing government funding by increasing the levels of discretionary grants and removing barriers for applicants will allow some grants to be fast tracked. The changes should reduce some administrative functions for applicants and the Council and help with work associated with hospital discharge and prevention cases. Changes will help the most vulnerable people that may otherwise not get assistance, which could lead to a strain on other public services. The grants will enable vulnerable and disabled occupiers to live safely and independently in their own homes for longer. The level of discretionary funding can be provided from within existing funds for as long as reasonably practicable with priority still given to mandatory grants.
