

Dear Swale Borough Council

Application for a change of use 193 High Street, Sheerness from its current use as a hairdressers to a micro pub.

The letter of notification was sent on 23rd. Feb. I received said letter on 6th. March. This curtailed the 28 days allotted in which to raise objections.

With regards to the above mentioned proposal, I write to you to raise my concerns as the proprietor of High Street, Sheerness. I understand that there has been an application to change the use of 193 High Street to to a licensed public house. I would ask that consideration be given to the following points in terms of the direct impact that this proposal will have on me, the other local residents and the wider community.

- Noise pollution from the public house, since I understand that the partition wall from the property has been removed in order to increase the floor space for his convenience. This has caused an increase in the audibility of noise from 193 High Street, Sheerness.
- The impact on my physical and psychological health.
- Passive smoking exposure to me and other members of the community, dependent on where people from the licensed premises smoke, either at the front or rear of the property. There is no space other than the footpath to the front of the property, which would be a concern for community members who would then need to walk through the smoke.
- The potential noise disturbance for other local residents.
- The impact on residents of patrons parking on the main road and neighbouring roads. I wonder if such residents have been consulted, namely those on Victoria St., St. George's Avenue and the High Street?
- The noise from patrons leaving the public house after midnight.
- Potential impact of anti-social behaviour associated with alcohol use.
- The increase of availability of alcohol with an increase in licensed establishments within a small geographical area, with the potential consequences to the detriment of public health.
- We would object to cigarette butts and bins in front of the property, people gathering to socialise outside our property, loss of privacy and loud music.
- Opening hours to include Sundays and Bank Holidays and late closing at midnight, resulting in inconvenience for people wishing to sleep.
- Issue of drain on the highway overflowing and flooding outside the property.
- Problem with parking to deliver goods as this is a main road near the zebra crossing.
- There already exists a public house on the opposite side of the road.
- "Neighbour" comments in favour of the application come from people who could not be described as geographically local to the area. It would appear that they have to come onto the island from Sittingbourne and even London in order to take part in the so-called community spirit.
- In addition there seems to be a pattern of positive character references advocated by the acquaintances of the applicants, which seems inappropriate.

Whilst I can appreciate the property is a commercial unit, as owner of property, I would ask that consideration be given to the impact that this change of use application would have on my quality of life and the potential impact that another licensed commercial property will have upon the community in which I live.

I have highlighted a number of points and would ask that you take these into serious consideration when making your decision. I am an elderly lady who has lived in this house for a number of years and would like to remain in my home without the noise and other potential issues related to living next door to a licensed public house
