Can you help this Council by telling us how many of the Sittingbourne Town centre restaurants are firmly committed by contract, what are the renting arrangements and whether you have a plan B, as Ashford now have, if the Sittingbourne restaurants prove unpopular with big chain companies over a period of time?

Thank you for confirming that labour policy is to attack growth and job creation. Our development agreement ensures that without the anchor tenants in place then we would not have begun construction. As you can see construction is well underway and we do indeed have not only The Light Cinema and Travelodge as anchor tenants but Nando's, Pizza Express and 2 further restaurants with completed Agreements to lease. This leaves 3 units currently unlet which at this stage of the development is a comfortable place for us and our development partner, Spirit of Sittingbourne have a further marketing campaign timed to go out shortly. We have legal safeguards in place which ensures that Spirit of Sittingbourne have to fund the rent of any vacant units for the first two years. Our plan B is to continue to deliver the promise this Conservative Administration has made
