In heavy rain, there is always a flood in the adjacent orchard. Residents report wastewater coming out of the verge. The sewage works would appear to already be full and running at full capacity. Contractors on site have advised there is no ability to upgrade it. Not only does the plant itself need upgrading, but the underground pipework also appears to be failing. Tankers are having to be brought in to remove excess sewerage every two weeks.
