## **1** Purpose of Report and Executive Summary

1.1 On 27 November 2023 a hearing was held by the standards subcommittee relating to complaints under the code of conduct against Cllr Richard Palmer. This report updates council on the subcommittee's finding.

#### 2 Background

- 2.1 An email sent to a Council Officer by Cllr Palmer in relation to a report for a planning application on 7 March 2023 resulted in a complaint to the monitoring officer (David Clifford) from a solicitor representing the council officer (who had resigned from the council).
- 2.2 The report of the monitoring officer made a preliminary finding that Cllr Palmer's comments amounted to a breach of the code of conduct and recommended that a standards subcommittee should be held to make a definitive finding. This meeting was held on 27 November 2023.

#### 3 Proposals

- 3.1 The subcommittee considered the relevant evidence, as well as the views of Cllr Palmer, the monitoring officer (Robin Harris) and the council's two independent persons appointed under s28 of the Localism Act. It unanimously determined that there had been a breach of the following paragraphs of the code of conduct:
  - Section 1.2 I treat local authority employees, employees and representatives of partner organisations and those volunteering for the local authority with respect and respect the role they play; and •
  - Section 2.1 I do not bully any person.
- 3.2 The subcommittee resolved the following sanctions should be applied
  - That the findings of the Panel into the consideration of a breach of the

Code be reported to Full Council;

- That the Group Leader be recommended to remove Cllr Palmer from the Standards Committee until the end of the civic year 23/24; and
- That Robin Harris should arrange relevant training for Cllr Palmer
- 3.3 Council is now *recommended* to note the findings of the standards subcommittee
