| 14 | Teynham and Lynstead - Hempstead Lane, Tonge End | reports sewage flowing into their rear garden from the manhole cover approximately every six months. It is reported that raw sewage runs down Frognal Lane approx twice a year and thence down the drives of the residents' houses. In heavy rain, there is always a flood in the adjacent orchard. Residents report wastewater coming out of the verge. The sewage works would appear to already be full and running at full capacity. Contractors on site have advised there is no ability to upgrade it. Not only does the plant itself need upgrading, but the underground pipework also appears to be failing. Tankers are having to be brought in to remove excess sewerage every two weeks. This is likely to get worse when 290 more homes are added and an upgrade is urgently required. Every time it rains, the drains at the Tonge end of Hempstead Lane are unable to cope with the water run-off - and the roadway floods. This floodwater then has nowhere to go apart from down the driveway at The Old Mill, Church Road ME9 9AW.
