Reasons for determination:

Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Reasons (state in full): The Sub-Committee noted that there were no representations from the Police once their conditions had been agreed and there was no other evidence provided to demonstrate a problem under this objective.

Public Safety

Reasons (state in full): No valid representations under this heading.

Prevention of nuisance

Reasons (state in full): The Sub-Committee had regard to all the written representations made under this heading and to the comments made at today's hearing. The Sub-Committee felt that in the absence of evidence in relation to this objective, concerns regarding problems with public nuisance were largely speculative.

Protection of children from harm
