#### C: Determination: The Committee has decided to:

grant the application on the terms applied for with conditions consistent with the operating schedule as amended by addition of conditions at page 55 of the agenda as agreed with Police.

# Reasons for determination:

Members of the Sub-Committee carefully considered the evidence before them at the hearing and in representations on the agenda.

Granting the licence for indoor, late night refreshment on conditions consistent with the operating scheduled is considered appropriate and proportionate to the evidence before them related to the promotion of all licensing objectives.

Members carefully balanced the business operation of the applicant and situation of the residents in the area. They took account of the fact that there was no continued objection from Police or any from Environmental Health. The conditions in place are

considered to meet concerns on promotion of the crime and disorder objective by preventing gathering of customers after 00.00.

In terms of public nuisance, Members were aware that trading after an initial issue has been until 23.00 and there is no factual evidence of level deliveries or use of motor cycles that may occur after 23.00 or the effect upon residential use of such deliveries. While there is a legitimate fear that there may be an issue, the Sub-Committee must consider real likelihood and evidence and do not believe rejection of the application would be an appropriate step to promote the licensing objectives at this time.

Members were aware of planning conditions recently imposed but these are part of a separate regime and any operation outside those conditions would be subject to planning enforcement unless application is made to vary those conditions and that would be subject to consultation.

There was not considered to be evidence relating to public safety or protection of children that required conditions. Health matters are not part of a licensing objective.

Informatives: The Sub-Committee are not able to consider or condition matters not relevant to the promotion of the licensing objectives and related to licensable activity at the premises to which the application relates. Where matters of concern relate to planning matters or any other legislation they should be reported to the appropriate body.

If issues should arise during the operation of the licence, which are related to the licensable activity at the premises and the promotion of the licensing objectives application may be made for a review of the premises licence, in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.
