Response: The Council has been working with local bus operators for four years to see how the wider aspirations of the town centre regeneration scheme can be delivered which includes the relocation of the market to the High Street. The two bus companies took the decision to move out of the High Street on 26 May 2017 and the other 2 January 2018 relocating to the rear of the Forum ahead of the agreed implementation date for the Road Traffic Order. As part of the wider regeneration plans an improved bus hub will be provided, inevitably any significant and successful regeneration scheme will cause some disruption.
